North Carolina

Another flippable seat for Democrats, another dead heat. Former Chief Justice of the NC Supreme Court, Democrat Cheri Beasley is facing off against Republican congressman, Ted Budd, to fill the seat of retiring GOP Senator Richard Burr.

Budd co-sponsored a House bill ban abortion nationwide after 15 weeks of pregnancy. Budd opposes the Affordable Care Act and voted to repeal it in 2017. He signed an amicus brief contesting the results of the 2020 presidential election, in four states, Georgia, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin Biden won. Enough said. But wait there's more: Budd opposes the For the People Act, intended to expand voting rights.

In comparison, Beasley was the first Black woman to win election to statewide office in North Carolina and the first African American woman to serve as chief justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court. She has been endorsed by: State Employees Association of North Carolina, North Carolina Advocates for Justice, Planned Parenthood Action Fund, Equality North Carolina, NARAL Pro-Choice America, Color of Change, Human Rights Campaign, NextGen PAC, Black Economic Alliance PAC, League of Conservation Voters Action Fund, Sierra Club, End Citizens United, Climate Hawks Vote, Congressional Black Caucus PAC, Democracy for America and EMILY's List.

There's one more thing to keep in mind. While NC Democrats are bullish about Beasley's prospects, the Democratic Senate Majority PAC has not made North Carolina the priority some other states are. Ohio

In the past several election cycles, Ohio has gone from a toss-up to pretty Red. This year it might be different. Democratic Congressman Tim Ryan is running against Silicon Valley/Hillbilly Elegy carpet bagger, J.D. Vance. Like many others, at this point the polls suggest that this is a toss-up.

Ryan, from the "rust belt" Youngstown area of NE Ohio is somewhat of a Democratic maverick; he doesn't always adhere to the party line. He is an advocate of economic protectionism, unionization, and steps to reduce income inequality. A critic of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and globalization, he has criticized George W. Bush's and Barack Obama's trade policies while supporting many of the tariffs passed during the Trump administration. OK, not a perfect progressive, but in a state like Ohio, those policies are winners. And compared to Vance, he's a must regarding your support if Democrats are to take the current GOP seat being vacated by Rob Portman.

Vance, who made billions in Silicon Valley has been described as a right-wing populist, national conservative, backed by venture capitalist Peter Thiel and endorsed by Tucker Carlson. The race in Pennsylvania has turned into a circus. WISCONSIN

Lt. Governor Mandela Barnes is challenging incumbent Republican Ron Johnson. Despite his (arguably) all-American looks, Johnson is one of the dumbest people in the Senate.

Some of the more recent polls showing a statistical tie (the Fox News poll does seem like an outlier) in a seat Democrats can flip.

Here are Barnes' positions on some key issues: He supports legislation that would codify federal protections of abortion rights nationwide, "to make Roe v Wade the law of the land." Supports red-flag laws, universal background checks for gun sales, and bans on ghost guns, assault weapons, and high-capacity magazines. Supports Medicare for All saying, "I've been on BadgerCare, and I've seen how critical it is for working people." Supports a Green New Deal, a \$15/hour minimum wage, eliminating cash bail nationwide and legalizing marijuana.

And Johnson: He rejects the scientific consensus on climate change, [7] describing it in 2021 as "bullshit. He defended tax cuts, falsely claiming that they reduced the deficit. He was one of 12 Republican senators to sign a letter threatening to filibuster any newly introduced gun control legislation. Johnson opposes the Affordable Care Act and has voted to repeal it. And if that's not enough, he voted against the Families First Coronavirus Response Act, which passed the Senate by a vote of **90–8**.
